



## Maasai Lodge Safari (19MLS3) – Tour Dossier

### Included Highlights

Maasai Mara National Reserve, Game drives

Great Rift Valley

### Intended Itinerary

#### Day 1:

##### Nairobi – Maasai Mara National Reserve

Distance travelled: +/- 385 Km

Approx driving time: Full day

Departing from your hotel, we make the journey from Nairobi west through the Great Rift Valley and head to the magnificent, world-famous Maasai Mara National Reserve. The Maasai Mara is Kenya's most prolific wildlife conservation area and is home to a superb collection of wildlife in a natural, wild and basically untouched state. The park has an incredible diversity of wildlife amongst rolling fertile plains dotted with the distinctive flat-topped acacia trees, (Mara is a Maasai word meaning spotted). It is watered by the tree-lined Mara River and its tributary the green and winding Talek River, full of hippo and crocodile. Lunch is taken en route after which we take an afternoon game drive to our lodge, spotting our first animals and birdlife en route. We arrive in the late afternoon and enjoy a relaxing dinner before spending the first night under the enormous skies of the Mara.

**Meals included:** Lunch, Dinner

#### Day 2:

##### Maasai Mara National Reserve

Distance travelled: Morning and afternoon game drives

We spend a full day in the park and explore the Mara on afternoon and early morning game drives. Situated alongside the border of the Reserve is the northern extension of the huge Serengeti to the south, in Tanzania. The Mara is crossed every

year from July to October by large herds of wildebeest and their zebra companions who journey from the adjoining Serengeti National Park on a continuous circular migration. Predators and scavengers follow in their wake, relying on the huge herds for food. If you are in the Mara during this season and are lucky enough to catch the migration it is a spectacular sight. However, the Mara is excellent for game viewing at any time of year and with luck we hope to spot some, if not all, of the Big 5 - elephant, lion, rhino, buffalo and leopard, as well as warthogs, baboons, spotted hyenas, grey jackals and prolific herds of Grant's gazelle, wildebeest, impala, topi, zebra and Maasai giraffe. Birds too, are prolific here, and well over 450 species have been recorded, including 57 species of birds of prey.

**Meals included:** Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

#### Day 3:

##### Maasai Mara - Nairobi

Distance travelled: +/- 385 Km

Approx driving time: Half day

After a hearty breakfast we leave our lodge and make our way back across the Rift Valley to Nairobi. We aim to arrive back in the Capital by lunchtime where the tour ends.

#### TOUR STYLE:

#### WHAT'S INCLUDED:

Tour highlights, accommodation, transport, meals as indicated, park fees, complimentary safari hat, 1-litre bottled mineral water per person per day whilst on safari and services of a tour guide/driver.

#### WHAT'S NOT INCLUDED:

Visas, travel insurance, flights, airport transfers, optional activities, laundry, gratuities, passport & visa fees, items of a personal nature.

#### SAFARI PASS:

This small group tour has a Safari Pass which is paid to your tour leader in Africa at the beginning of the tour (or pre-paid by arrangement prior to your tour). This is separate and in addition to the Tour Price, which is paid before travel, and is paid in the currency listed on the website (usually US dollars in clean, un-torn post



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2008 edition notes). The Safari Pass covers selected park entries, activities and excursions and some accommodation along the way where payment goes directly to the supplier. The purpose of the separate payment is to ensure local suppliers benefit directly from the income.

**ACCOMMODATION:** Comfortable twin share lodges or tented camps with en suite  
**TRANSPORT:** Safari vehicle (mini bus with pop up roof for game viewing)

### BOOKING INFORMATION

When you make a confirmed booking and pay in full you will receive a Travel Voucher giving full details of your joining point. Nairobi (NBO) is well served by a variety of airlines. Your travel agent can advise on flights to and from the start and finish of your tour.

### JOINING INFORMATION

Meeting point in **Nairobi:** Pick up from your hotel in Nairobi  
 (If we have not reserved your accommodation in Nairobi for you please remember to tell us where you are staying the night before departure!)

Tour start time: 07h00 (7:00am)

Tour end point in **Nairobi:** Drop off at your hotel in Nairobi

Tour end time: Early afternoon on day 3

### PRE TOUR ACCOMMODATION

This tour departs Nairobi at 07:00am on day 1; we strongly recommend therefore that you plan to arrive the day before departure to overcome any jet-lag and acclimatise to Africa. We would be happy to book pre-tour accommodation for you – please call or email us (or speak to your agent) with your arrival details and accommodation requirements.

However please book early to avoid disappointment and the risk of having to find more expensive (or less convenient) lodgings.

If time allows, we also suggest planning a night or two extra (after your tour) to make the most of Nairobi and the surrounding area.

### WHAT TO BRING

Please try to keep your luggage to a minimum, bearing in mind that most airlines impose a 20kg luggage limit. A large soft holdall or backpack and a smaller day pack is ideal. On this tour you will need a mixture of lightweight cool clothing for the day and warm clothing (i.e. fleece, long trousers and hat) for mornings and evenings as it can be cool on game drives. Pack a light rain jacket. It is advisable to bring mosquito spray throughout the year. Bring a towel if required. A money belt/pouch that can be worn comfortably beneath your clothing is recommended. Please avoid bringing unnecessary valuables. A power bank is useful to charge electronic devices.

**NB KENYA PLASTIC BAG BAN** - All forms of plastic carrier bags are banned in Kenya; including 'Airport Duty Free' plastic bags, airport security plastic bags for liquids, shopping bags, storage bags, zip-lock plastic bags. The strict ban applies to everyone and it is mandatory that you leave any form of plastic bag/s at your country of origin.



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### VACCINATIONS / HEALTH

The table below indicates the vaccinations suggested for travel on this tour but **should be treated as a guide only**. You should seek professional medical advice from your GP or clinic at least six weeks prior to departure. Please note some areas visited are **malarial**. We recommend you speak to your doctor or travel clinic about appropriate anti-malarial tablets.

### VISA REQUIREMENTS

The table below indicates the visas required for travel to the countries on this tour but **should be treated as a guide only**. At least one month prior to travel seek confirmation from embassies or a visa specialist, that these requirements are still current. For UK citizens the Foreign & Commonwealth Office (FCO) offers free up-to-date travel info: [www.fco.gov.uk](http://www.fco.gov.uk). For other nationalities a number of travel advice websites are listed on the Acacia website.

**Kenya E-VISA:** Should you wish to have your visa before arrival, Kenya now offers the option to pre-apply for an e-visas online. This may take up to 7 days to process. Alternatively, qualifying passport holders can obtain an entry visa on arrival in Kenya. To check whether you qualify, please check with the Kenyan Embassy or Mission in your country of origin.

**NB** The above is a guide only. Please check all visa requirements at least one month in advance of travel. Most nationalities do not need to obtain any of the above visas in advance. They are available at the border entry points and payable in US\$ cash.

### MONEY MATTERS

#### PERSONAL EXPENSES

Naturally you will require extra money for your own personal spending on the tour, for snacks, drinks, souvenirs, tips and items of a personal nature. Everybody has different spending habits but as a guideline we suggest you budget US\$15-20 per day. Most spending will be in US\$ cash but exchange some money into Kenyan Shillings.

- **Spending money** is best carried as cash is US dollars (US Dollars in clean, un-torn post 2008 edition notes). Your guide will give general guidance about spending during the tour.
- **Currencies** are as follows: Kenyan Shillings, US Dollars
- **ATM machines** are found in Nairobi
- **Credit cards** can be used to pay for larger optional activities although fees for use may be higher than you are accustomed to.

#### TIPPING

As in many areas where tourism is an important contributor to the economy it has become customary to offer a small gratuity to local staff at the end of the tour if service has been of a high standard. Naturally this always remains at your discretion.
